## Ms.Bove's Brainiacs

## Academics:

Reading: During our EL block, the students have been using poetry to practice their fluent reading, as well as reading pourqoui tales to learn about narrative texts. We have been breaking down the structure of a narrative, including a beginning that introduces the characters and describes the situation, a middle that includes a problem and explains how the character reacts to the problem, and an ending that provides a solution to the problem and explains the purpose of the story. The students are now planning their own pourqoui tale and will be working through the writing process before publishing their work. We have also been reading Shel Silverstein's Where the Sidewalk Ends during read aloud, which the students have really been enjoying. I told them that if they are interested in memorizing a poem and reciting it for the class, I would provide them the opportunity!

Math: In math, we are now working on multi-step problems involving all four math operations. The students are learning how to analyze the "story" in the problem and think about the information provided to help them understand what pieces they need to solve for first. Students should continue to practice their multiplication facts at home. We are taking our 6's and 7's next week, followed by the 8's and 12 's during the final week before break. As always, students are able do retakes for any quizzes they don't pass. At this point, memorizing the facts should be getting easier for the students, as they are now only learning a few new facts with each round. For instance, if they have already learned their $1^{\prime} s, 2^{\prime} s, 3$ 's, $4^{\prime} s, 5^{\prime}, 9^{\prime}, 10^{\prime} s$, and $11^{\prime} s$, then the only new facts they need to work on are $6 \times 6,6 \times 7,6 \times 8$, and $6 \times 12$. Please make sure they are working towards this goal!
